Scott Kennedy Field Upgrade Treatment

During an annual inspection of the Scott Kennedy Field turf, staff and Field Turf representatives noticed some grass blade loss was occurring in some areas of the field. In order to treat the loss immediately, Field Turf scheduled an upgrade treatment of the synthetic turf. The treatment includes removal of all infill material, injection of adhesive to onto the grass blades and re-application of the infill material. The process began on Monday and takes approximately one week allowing the field to re-open next week. All costs are being covered by the warrantee with no costs being borne by the City.

SCPD Narcan Program Earns Overwhelming Approval from Community and Model Law Enforcement Agencies in Monterey Bay

SCPD is the first law enforcement agency in Santa Cruz County to be trained in the use of



Naloxone. The pilot program started with 12 SCPD officers equipped with life-saving Narcan kits. Officers train on how to recognize life threatening opioid overdoses from such drugs as heroin and prescription painkillers and administer the intranasal naloxone as an antidote. Since the pilot program started, SCPD officers have saved three persons using Narcan Kits. Due to the success of the pilot program, SCPD is looking into expanding the program department wide. Early intervention by SCPD officers equipped with Narcan Kits increases the chances of survival for an overdose victim. The Narcan

kits have become a useful tool in helping officers as first responders and in safeguarding lives.

Engineering

We began construction of the 2017 Overlay Project on King Street. This work, funded by Measure H tax dollars, includes rehabilitation of local streets that have experienced significant deterioration at seven locations. Our first Street Smarts after school "Club Live" groups began at Santa Cruz City Schools. Branciforte students meet on Mondays in Room 9 and Mission Hill students meet on Wednesdays. Wastewater Treatment Facility

The maintenance department dismantled a dewatering centrifuge, an integral part of solids dewatering, to stop a leak that resulted from a bad rubber gasket. Maintenance also working an extra day to overhaul both cogeneration engines to ensure proper operation during the important peak PG&E rates. Having these engines operational saves the facility around \$100,000 in monthly electricity costs, money saved by producing our own electricity from natural gas instead of purchasing electricity from PG&E. The mechanics also conducted an oil change on all three of the backup emergency diesel generators which were then successfully tested under load by operations. Meanwhile, electricians have been monitoring various equipment such as the harmonic conditioner at the UV system to ensure the temperature of the parts is within correct range.

Environmental Compliance Laboratory

The Environmental Compliance Program in association with the California Water Environment Association hosted the Pollution Prevention Awards 2017 on Sept. 21 to honor local and regional businesses that have furthered major environmental stewardship programs including pharmaceutical diversion from water sources and treatment facilities, and reclaiming water for reuse purposes.
