

- Hair Salons and Barbershops
- All Retail with max 25% capacity
- Nail Salons & Personal Care Services
- Hotels and Lodging
- Shopping Centers (Malls, Destination Centers, Swap Meets) with:
  - Max 25% capacity
  - Closed common areas
  - Closed food courts

##### SOME OUTDOOR ONLY ACTIVITIES ARE ALLOWED INCLUDING:

- Restaurants (including bars, breweries, and distilleries providing meal service)
- Wineries
- Gyms and Fitness Centers
- Places of Worship
- Museums, Zoos, and Aquariums
- Movie Theaters
- Family Entertainment Centers
- Gatherings with maximum 3 households

Santa Cruz County remains in the most restrictive tier, purple Tier 1, which allows outdoor dining, hair salons, personal services, and some other operations closed under the stay home order to resume. [View the full list of what is allowed under each tier here.](#) Please note that while our numbers have been steadily improving, we still need to reduce our adjusted daily new cases down by 5.2 cases per day per 100,000 (we are currently at 12.2 cases per day per 100,000) to meet the next less restrictive tier and hold that lower metric (of 7 adjusted daily cases per 100,000 or less) for two consecutive weeks before we move into the next less restrictive tier. Please also note that while our numbers have been improving, our local health authorities and experts have been warning us about another peak related to the new strain in the coming months. We will continue to monitor this weekly and provide information to our businesses regarding our progress towards reaching less restrictive operating tiers.

## Regal Cinema 9 Reportedly Closing

We have heard the reported news that Regal notified their employees the Downtown Regal Cinema 9 will be permanently closing. We have reached out to both the property managers at SyWest and Regal Cinemas for confirmation of this report and to understand the future plans for this space. We will provide more information when available as we monitor this closely.

## Housing Development & Preservation | City Receives \$5 Million For Local Housing Trust Fund

The City of Santa Cruz has been awarded \$5 million through the State Housing and Community Development (HCD) Department's highly competitive grant program, Local Housing Trust Fund (LHTF).

There were 33 applicants competing for the \$57 million total funds, which were oversubscribed by 107% (\$118 million total was requested).

The City finished in joint 3rd place with 5 other jurisdictions out of the 17 jurisdictions awarded. To score competitively in the application, these funds have been allocated to the development of both the Pacific Station and Library Mixed-Use Projects.
