Water

Work continues on the Newell Creek Dam inlet/outlet project, despite equipment glitches that have caused the project to slow down. The roadheader, which is the piece of equipment used for the critical tunneling work, was out of commission due to a mechanical problem. Thankfully it's back in service and despite its set back, we had the best day of tunnel drilling yet on Wednesday, with 60' of progress made. You can see the roadheader we're using in the photo below.



We continue the prep work to mobilize construction of the three new concrete tanks at the treatment plant. In addition to equipment and materials prep, we're also closely monitoring the environment for any nesting birds or other wildlife that would prevent us from beginning construction. We also begin prepping next week for mobilization on a smaller project at the treatment plant, which is to widen the entry gate/arrival area. The entry gate area has long been insufficient to meet the volume and size of vehicles coming into the plant, and with increased construction traffic anticipated during the next few years, widening the entrance became critical.

Yet another project is getting off the ground, with final submittals for retrofitting the Laguna dam going to regulators. This week we submitted the diversion and dewatering plans to the regional board, and California Department of Fish and Wildlife. Another big project milestone!

Homelessness Response

On June 29 at 11 a.m., the City will have another hearing with Judge Susan Van Keulen regarding the federal injunction governing San Lorenzo Park and the Homeless Union vs. City of Santa case. Participation information for the Zoom conference can be found on Judge Van Keulen's website:

Additionally, Director Lee Butler presented an update on homelessness response efforts and the status of the County's upcoming demobilization of COVID-19 resources at the June Council meeting. The <u>presentation</u> can be found alongside the staff report on the <u>Council agenda for June 22</u>.

Today, June 25, the Public Works team [picked up 7280lbs or 3.64tons of garbage below the Soquel St bridge downstream from SLP/Benchlands. Staff used a backhoe to pick up as much trash as possible without disturbing the campers. This effort was initiated primarily in response to the rising levels of the San Lorenzo River due to the river mouth being closed and the threat of debris entering the water.









Unfortunately, there is still trash and other debris around tents where campers are still residing and crews could not access. The Encampment Assessment Team will continue to monitor and manage the issue.

Public Works

Engineering

The large yellow and blue "Welcome to River Street" sign has been temporarily removed to permit construction work on the City of Santa Cruz Highway 1/9 Intersection Improvements Project. The sign will be reinstalled near the end of the project within about 10 months.

The Highway 1/9 Intersection Improvements Project is considered a high priority City of Santa Cruz transportation congestion and safety improvement project. It will provide traffic operation and safety improvements by reconstructing the existing intersection to accommodate additional lanes, safety lighting, green bike lanes, sidewalks and accessibility ramps that meet current standards.





The **2021 Overlay Project** continued construction this week. The project has been doing pavement work at the following locations:

- Delaware Avenue from Fair Avenue to Woodrow Avenue
- Delaware Avenue from National Street to Santa Cruz Street
- King Street from Miramar Drive to the west end of Mission Street

The **2021 Surface Seal Project** had to reschedule the installation of Microsurfacing, scheduled for Monday, June 21, due to weather. Microsurfacing installation is now re-scheduled for the second week of July. The public is advised to seek alternate routes when possible. We apologize for any inconvenience this construction work may cause and appreciate the public's cooperation.
