Neighbors of Lower Ocean Hold 24th Annual Fall Clean Up

After a 2 ½ year pause due to COVID-19, the Neighbors of Lower Ocean marked its 24th annual fall clean-up day in partnership with the City of Santa Cruz on Saturday, October 15, 2022. The event provided property owners, tenants, and business owners the opportunity to dispose of rubbish and work collectively to keep their neighborhood clean.

Neighbors met, shared snacks, participated in clean-up activities, and traded reusable treasures. At the Grey Bears collection station on Barson Street, residents were able to share with neighbors furniture, toys, bicycles, and other materials, preventing useable house-hold items from going into the city landfill. Senior City Planner Katherine Donovan provided residents with a housing and neighborhood survey to gather information about the Lower Ocean community's needs.



The Street Maintenance Division placed portable flood lights downtown in preparation for Halloween. The lighting was coordinated with the Police Department to support public safety on Halloween night. The lights were removed the morning after Halloween. Resource Recovery Collections also assisted with post-Halloween downtown clean-up on Tuesday morning.

The Fleet Maintenance Division assisted Resource Recovery with unloading nine pallets of countertop food waste pails. The pails will be distributed in the coming weeks to expand the City's Food Waste Diversion Program for buildings that contain five or more dwelling units, as required by the SB1383 mandate.
