Santa Cruz Fire Department Hosts County Training at Old Gateway School Site

Santa Cruz Fire Department started off 2023 by hosting a large-scale training exercise at the former Gateway school site located at 126 Eucalyptus. Over the course of the training, 104 firefighters participated, providing 12 sessions of 2 ½ hour training blocks. Each training session included practice on forcible entry strategies and techniques; hose and ladder deployments; offensive structural firefighting strategies and tactics; victim search and rescue; and a focus on overall firefighter safety and accountability in these dangerous and critical situations.

The participating Santa Cruz County Fire agencies included the Santa Cruz Fire Department, Central Fire Protection District of Santa Cruz County, Scotts Valley Fire Protection District, Watsonville Fire Department and Cal-Fire Santa Cruz Unit. Training Battalion Chief Ryan Reber, Fire Captain Eric Chitwood, and Firefighter-Paramedic Kyle Foster were instrumental in delivering this training with passion and enthusiasm that were palpable and contagious. Because these agencies respond together at any large-scale fire or emergency within the county, countywide training is vital for overall public safety.
