





Home Available for Purchase through Habitat for Humanity

One single-family three-bedroom two-bath, ADA-compliant home in Live Oak is available for purchase for low-income households. The unit is available through Habitat for Humanity Monterey Bay and applications are being accepted now through February 17, 2023.

You may qualify for homeownership if:

- You are a first-time homebuyer
- Your gross annual income is within 50 – 80% of Santa Cruz County AMI Limits
- You have a need for an ADA-compliant home
- Your credit score is 620 or higher
- You are willing to partner with Habitat for Humanity through sweat equity

Coastal Permit for 126 Eucalyptus ProjectAppealed with the Coastal Commission


In November, 2022, the City Council approved an assisted living and memory care facility project permit for 126 Eucalyptus. The Coastal Permit associated with the project has been appealed to the Coastal Commission. The appeal will be heard on February 10th via Zoom. At this hearing, the Commission will determine whether the appeal has brought up a "substantial issue" with the project. If no substantial issue is found, the appeal is denied. If a substantial issue is found, then the Coastal Commission will set a second hearing to hear the Coastal Permit de novo, looking at the permit in its entirety and not just on the points of the appeal. The Coastal Commission staff recommended on this appeal a decision of no substantial issue. The related staff report is available [online](#).





Street Maintenance Team Assists with Community Clean-Up

Volunteers from the Street Maintenance division assisted in collecting and hauling debris along the San Lorenzo River levee. The event was coordinated by many local community groups and hosted 143 volunteers to collect trash from the watershed on Saturday, January 28. In two hours of work, volunteers collected almost 2 tons of trash between the Trestle Bridge and Highway 1. The road crew also removed a broken guardrail on Hiawatha Avenue and filled in the area that had washed out with base rock and cobblestone. A new guardrail will be installed next week.
