


Sidewalk Vending Enforcement Expands on April 1, 2023

The new season for sidewalk vending enforcement began on Saturday, April 1 and continues through October 31. Vending on Beach Street is strictly prohibited during this time. Proactive weekend enforcement will occur on Pacific Avenue and the Beach Street side streets. Permits needed to engage in sidewalk vending within City limits are available at the Planning and Community Development Department counter in City Hall Annex Room 101, Monday through Thursday, 7:30 AM to 11:30 AM. Additional permits needed to vend on Pacific Avenue are available at the Parks and Recreation Department. The Code Compliance Division will be working in conjunction with the Parks and Recreation Department, the Police Department, the Parking Division, and the County Environmental Health Department. Together, these teams will monitor the selected proactive areas while assisting and educating the public throughout the season. 


Welcome New Downtown Business, Mad Yolks!

Public Works Updates

Environmental Compliance

The Environmental Laboratory has been formally recognized as an "Early Adopter" of the Environmental Laboratory Accreditation Program. High standards not met by most municipal laboratories in the State dictated the necessary mergers of many labs in the State and the closure of others. The City embarked upon the transformation of the wastewater lab to certified professional levels with higher quality processes and personnel. Our lab is now capable of servicing the community's tremendous environmental and public (non-clinical) needs for now and the foreseeable future.

Street Maintenance

When neighbors reported the roadway rising on Acadia Avenue, our Streets crew dug out the road and discovered clay, which had caused the hazardous formation. The crew dug out the clay, replaced it with base rock and slurry, and then poured a layer of asphalt. The Street Maintenance team upgraded the striping on Baldwin Street in an effort to prevent cut-through traffic at the intersection. Street Maintenance staff also reinstalled signs and barriers on West Cliff Dr. Over the weekend, barriers and signs were moved or missing altogether. Barricades are placed there for the community's safety as West Cliff eroded rapidly with the January storms.

Facility Maintenance

After a few years of troublesome leaks and a core test showing that the existing roofing system had completely failed, the Facility Maintenance team hired a contractor to replace the roof on Fire Station 2 on Soquel Avenue.
