
story times, movie nights, crafting classes, lectures, and more.

On April 29, 2023, from 8:00 a.m.–11:30 a.m. (or when the bins are full), the Neighbors of Lower Ocean (NOLO) will be conducting its 25th annual spring clean-up day in partnership with the City of Santa Cruz. Organizers and participants include: City Planning Code Compliance Division, Public Works (Sanitation), Parks and Recreation, NOLO neighborhood, and the Grey Bears non-profit organization. This event encourages property owners, tenants, and business owners to keep their neighborhoods free of clutter and rubbish. Each year, community participation increases as word spreads about the clean-up day.

Neighbors will meet, greet, share information, eat snacks, and, at times, trade reusable treasures. Grey Bears can reuse the furniture, toys, bicycles, and other electronics. When these items are repurposed, useable household items are diverted from the City landfill. 

# SCMU Resumes Shut Offs for Nonpayment in May, 2023

Customers with delinquent water bill payments will receive their last courtesy notice this month that shut offs for nonpayment will resume in May. SCMU has not shut off for nonpayment since the start of the pandemic. Field staff, however, have been posting delinquency door hangers for the past 18 months, encouraging customers to pay down their past-due balance.

In the meantime, several forms of rate assistance have been made available for late-paying customers, including two rounds of COVID arrearage payments, COVID rent relief (including utilities), and the Low-Income Household Water/Wastewater Assistance Program (LIHWAP). Once shut-offs resume, the law requires SCMU to offer payment arrangements for

qualifying low-income customers. For non-low-income customers, SCMU will consider offering payment arrangements when extenuating financial circumstances, such as unexpected costs due to recent storm damage, impact customers' abilities to pay.
